

THE NEVADA SOARING ASSOCIATION. INC.
BY-LAWS

I.

The Nevada Soaring Association, Inc., was incorporated under the laws of the State of Nevada on the 13th day of April, 1958, as a non-profit corporation for the purpose of educating and instructing its members in the art of soaring, in navigation and meteorology and all other subjects concerned with and utilized in the art of soaring.

II.

A meeting of the members shall be held annually at which meeting the Officers of this association shall be elected. The Officers so elected shall also constitute the Board of Directors of this Association. All other meetings shall be held at such times and such places as the Officers shall designate. A notice of all meetings shall be given to the members by the Administrative Officer.

III.

All active members of this association shall be entitled to one vote. Unless otherwise stated herein the business of this association may be conducted by a majority vote of the active members present at any regular meeting of the association, by proxy or by vote or mail-in ballot provided that there are present at least two (2) officers of the association.

IV.

There will be at all times a minimum of three and a maximum of five officers. All Officers so elected shall serve for a term of one year without compensation. Vacancies shall be filled by the majority vote of the remaining officers and any officer so elected shall serve until the next annual meeting.

V.

Membership in this association shall be upon application to the Officers and in compliance with the following terms and conditions:

- a. Payment to the association of an initial membership fee in such sum as may be set from time to time by the Board of directors.
- b. Payment of dues to NSA,
- c. Acceptance by the Officers.

VII.

The active membership of any member who shall be in arrears in the payment of dues, fees or assessments for a period of three (3) months shall be automatically placed in an inactive status without voting or flight privileges. The membership of any person who shall be in arrears in the payment of dues, fees and assessments for a period of six (6) months shall be subject to termination by the Officers of this association.

VIII.

Any member may request the Officers to suspend his membership in the association and the Officers shall thereupon place such person an inactive status. No person whose membership is inactive, whether by voluntary act or otherwise as provided in the By-Laws, shall have the right to vote, the right or privilege to use any of the facilities or equipment of the association, or the right to participate in any way in the activities of this association, nor shall he/she be required to pay dues. Any person whose membership is inactive shall be entitled to regain full, membership in the association by compliance with all of the following conditions:

- a. Payment of any sums of money which may have been due to this association at the time the membership of such person was placed in inactive status.
- b. If such person shall have been in an inactive status for a period of time less than 12 months in duration, payment of dues for such period of inactivity. .

The Officers of this association. upon a determination that all of the above requirements have been complied with, shall declare such person to be a member of this association.

IX.

Honorary, memberships may be granted for one (1) year or longer by a vote of a majority of the Board. An honorary member shall not be required to pay dues or special assessments and shall not be entitled to voting privileges or flight privileges unless specifically granted.

X.

By majority vote of the active members, the membership fee of a prospective or the dues of an active member may be waived or a lifetime membership granted in this association.

XI.

Special assessments may be levied upon the members of this association upon the vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the total active members if this association,

XII.

Flight privileges of any member may be suspended at any regular meeting of this association for careless or reckless operation of an aircraft owned by this association for a period of time not to exceed six (6) months. Such member shall be given notice of the meeting and an opportunity to be heard. The Flight Operations Officer shall have the authority to suspend the flight privileges of any member until the next regular meeting of the association.

XIII.

Any member of this association, whether active or honorary, may withdraw as a member by filing a written resignation with the Administrative Officer of this association.

XIV

No member upon termination of his membership shall be entitled to a refund of any nature of the initial membership fee nor shall there be any transfer of memberships in this association.

XV

All flight operations of this association shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulation prescribed therefore by the Federal Aviation Agency.

XVI.

Subject to the limitations of the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws and the Laws of the State of Nevada, the powers of this association shall be exercised by or under authority of, and the business and affairs of this association shall be controlled by the Directors of this association.

XVII

In the event of the dissolution of this association, all assets will be sold and the proceeds will be distributed to the membership in accordance with a formula proposed by the board of Directors.

XVIII.

The By-Laws of this association may be repealed or amended or any new provisions adopted by a vote of one-half (1/2) of the active members of this association, provided that such change is approved by two-thirds (2/3) of the Directors of this association, but in any event may be repealed or amended or any new provisions adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the members at any regular meeting of this association.
