Treasurer's Report was presented by Robert Spielman as Treasurer Armstrong was unable to attend. The club is healthy financially with adequate funds in the Wells Fargo checking and savings account and also a maturing CD.

Stoney provided an overview of our fleet.

During the annual of the L-23 damage was found on the forward portion of the fuselage. Corrie is working making the repairs.

Discussion was held to consider selling the 1-36. There is very little use of the 1-36, less than 30 hours in 2016, the L-33 is much more often used. It appears having 2 L-33s assembled and available, they would be busy.

Members suggested consider also selling the 2-32 and purchase of a second L-23. There was agreement that having two, two-place ships is a good thing.
